Capstone Self-Assessment

Your Capstone Project and Capstone Presentation count for 60% of your final grade in CLC 12 (30% for each). This self-assessment is designed to help you prepare for each of these.

Part 1: Capstone Project

In April you will have a chance to present your Capstone Project. The emphasis of this project is the Passion Project but there are other components that need to be addressed as well. The Capstone Project Check List shows the different components that should be covered by your capstone project.

Think about how you want to cover each of these. Will you have a page dedicated to each area, will you have photos or text to prompt you to remember each...? You only have 20 minutes to present your Capstone Project, so it is important that you organize your time and thoughts. In the past most students have used a website, blog, or PowerPoint to organize their content. As a rule, less is more when it comes to your actual computer-based presentation (website, blog...). Try to emphasize photos rather than text.

Part 2: Capstone Presentation

The Capstone Presentation will be done in front of a panel of community members and Selkirk Staff. The presentation itself will be assessed based on your communication skills and your ability to answer questions from the Capstone Presentation questions list.

To prepare for your presentation think about how you will discuss each topic. Consider how you might transition between each topic and what important information you want to highlight in each section.

Consider the following as an example of how you might introduce your professional portfolio.
