
Course Overview:

Career Life Connections (CLC) 12 is a graduation requirement that is designed to help students transition to life after high school.

Over the course of the year students will complete a series of tasks designed to develop a sense of purpose and directionality.



Sense of purpose

Career-Life Education and Career-Life Connections are designed to assist students in reflecting on where their personal interests and strengths overlap with emerging career-life opportunities in the world. Students can develop a sense of purpose when these three qualities overlap, offering possible career-life directions that are both personally meaningful and viable. This type of purposeful career-life development is facilitated by the learning standards of CLE and CLC and ongoing mentorship opportunities throughout the secondary years.

Course Delivery:

CLC 12 is not a traditional class. The content of CLC 12 is designed to be complete either at home or during Storm Blocks. Although CLC 12 is outside the timetable it is not a distance learning course. Students will be expected to attend seminars and learning sessions at multiple points throughout the year.

My intention for CLC 12 is for it to be flexible and student driven. Out of respect for the busy lives of grade 12 students every effort will be made to build informative and meaningful tasks without making them overly burdensome.

Assessment:

CLC 12 is a 4-credit course that is a necessary component of the graduation program. Students will be given a letter grade upon completion of their capstone presentation.

Core Assignments:

CLC 12 is broken into 4 parts:	
Seminar's	
0	Students will attend at least 10 seminars, the content of which will relate to adulthood (taxation, financial planning, work life balance).
Capstone Project	
0	A projected related to an area of high interest or importance to the student. Creation of a professional and personal portfolios.
Capstone Presentation	
0	Presentation of your capstone project to a panel.

o A series of short assignments designed to promote personal and academic reflection on themes related to the core competencies.
